 General Agriculture-Horticulture Guidelines & Rules:

1. The quality desired in Agricultural and Horticultural product exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market.
2. Exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as the stage of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the Food and Agriculture Code in order to be considered for premium awards.
3. SECTION 42513: "Mature means having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine."
4. SECTION 42515: "Overripe means having an advanced state of ripeness maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state. VARIETY OF PRODUCTS MUST BE ADEQUATELY & CORRECTLY LABELED.
5. All State and Local Rules apply.

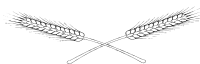

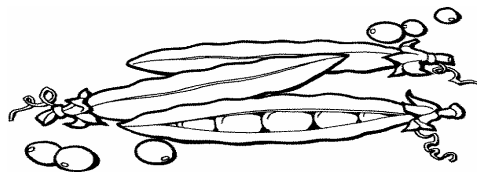
